The meeting welcomed the news of an event in the Summer to commemorate 100 years of a bus service in Elstree and Borehamwood (involving bus rides and a focal point at Allum Manor).

<u>Inappropriate use of Byways by Motorised Vehicles</u>

The Meeting recognised the ongoing problem of damage caused by inappropriate use of Byways by scramblers and other motorised vehicles in the local area. The problem was shared by Aldenham Parish Council and it was noted that Tykeswater Lane was particularly affected. It was noted that County Council representatives would be asked to help tackle the issue going forwards.

Storage Space at Band Sand

It was noted that some Members of the Public welcomed the introduction of a Band Stand at Meadow Park but also called for adequate storage facilities to be made available on site to facilitate the effective running of concerts.
