It was suggested that the scheme could help to facilitate a Summer season of concerts and that the Town Council might wish to support the venture through its Community Grants process (to be considered initially by the General Management Committee). Aberford Park and Meadow Park were listed as possible sites for such a structure. It was noted that Cllr Mrs P Strack would meet in January 2018 with interested parties in order to prepare a report for the Council or one of its Committees to consider in detail. A Grady was thanked for his presentation and for proposing this community asset to the Council.

Leeming/Aycliffe Big Local Advisory Panel

Elstree and Borehamwood Museum Group

- A presentation at Fountain Court on changes in Borehamwood since the 1920's:
- Three Counties radio interview;
- Friends Evening event with a talk on the history of Haberdashers since the year 1400 and a school visit from the school on 16 November 2017; and
- A new exhibition "All Change" in relation to the 150 years of the railways project.

Growing visitor numbers were welcomed in July (300), August (669), September (274) and October (264).

Borehamwood & Elstree Twin Town Association

42. PUBLIC PARTICIPATION – QUESTION TIME

Meeting Dates

Responding to a query concerning the clash of Borough and Town Council meeting dates it was noted that the Town Councilmeeting date was determined in accordance with the Town Council's Meeting Dates Policy and at the time of agreement, no such conflict existed. It was appreciated that such clashes were undesirable but also on rare occasions these were also unavoidable.

Local Radio Station

Responding to a query, Cllr Mrs P Strack agreed to further investigate the Town Council's involvement in setting up a local radio station. It was noted that 'Radio Zimbabwe' operated from Borehamwood. Some Members felt that local schools and colleges might be interested in helping to support such a project.

Defibrillator Sub-Committee

Responding to a query, Cllr Mrs P Strack agreed to further investigate the matter of a reported missing defibrillator at Aberford Park and a query concerning £750 raised to install an item at Keystone Passage in Borehamwood. It was noted that, once donated, the defibrillators became the responsibility of the organisation receiving the items for the purposes of maintenance and replacement. It was further noted that at the Annual Council Meeting in May 2017, the Defibrillator Working Group had been disbanded, its task having been completed. It had previously been commented that Keystone Passage was already served by a nearby defibrillator at 96 Shenley Road.

Retrospective application for conversion of loft to habitable room incorporating hip to gable roof alteration with one front roof light and a rear dormer window (revised).

Observation: At its meeting on 26 September 2017 the Environment and Planning Committee commented that retrospective applications were outside the spirit of planning law.

[Post Meeting Note: At the time of the meeting, no facility was available to submit online Consultee comments].

17/1434/FUL - 29 Lullington Garth, Borehamwood WD6 2HD

Demolition of existing dwelling and detached garage and erection of replacement 2 storey, detached 6 bed dwelling to include habitable loft accommodation with a front dormer window and roof lights to all elevations.

Observation: At its meeting on 26 September 2017 the Environment and Planning Committee considered the application to be overdevelopment and raised concerns over the effect on the street scene.

[Post Meeting Note: At the time of the meeting, no facility was available to submit online Consultee comments].

Conversion of garage to habitable room and erection of single storey rear extension and canopy following removal of existing conservatory.

17/1819/FUL - 9 Grove Road, Borehamwood WD6 5DU

Erection of 2 storey side and rear extension to facilitate conversion of single dwelling to 2 self-contained flats (1 x 2 bed & 1 x 3 bed) with access and parking. (Revised Application).

Observation: At its meeting on 26 September 2017 the Environment and Planning Committee considered the application to be overdevelopment and commented that family sized dwellings (3 to 4 bedroom) were needed in the Community.

Demolition of existing outbuildings and erection of single storey side and rear extensions and rear basement excavation.




